# **Pre School Caterpillar Class**


We have used The Jolly Postman by Allan Alhberg as the focus of much of our learning this week. The children have been very busy in the writing area creating postcards, letters and invitations with stamps and envelopes which have then been posted in our post box. We have read the traditional tales referenced in the story such as Little Red Riding Hood and Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

Philippa created maps with the children during Forest Time and they went hunting in the wooded area for treasure! We decorated gingerbread men on Thursday and the children created some beautiful biscuits. We have some real life

caterpillars in our classroom that the children have been fascinated to observe. We are excitedly waiting for them to build their cocoons at the moment! Our Shape of the Week has been a triangle and our phonics have been 's' and 'd.' In phonics the children have been introduced to Fred the frog and are beginning to understand how he talks by breaking each word into each sound.

# **BLYTON CLASS**

This week Blyton have continued the life cycle theme with the emphasis being on the chicken life cycle. The children explored both fertilized and unfertilized eggs and learned about the difference. They then constructed their own

creative lifecycles, and verbalised the life cycle in our talk for writing lessons.

We undertook subtracting in maths in a variety of ways: we used fingers, ladybird counters, number lines and counting back as a means of finding the answer. We learned that the biggest number will always go first in a subtraction number sentence.

Mr Hall set us a PE circuit challenge this week including hurdles and a sprint finish which went down well with all the children. We are all grasping the concept of team work more and more. A special mention to Thomas who was fantastic at throwing and beat everyone (including Miss Judge) at throwing his beanbag the furthest.

We distributed our completed glass pieces this week. The children were absolutely overjoyed with them. A huge thank you to Sarah Sillibourne who did a wonderful job with the design and has promised to revisit Smarden at some point soon.

## **AUSTEN CLASS**

In Maths, Year 1 have started a new unit counting to 50 -100 and beyond using our number bonds. In English, Year 1 have finished the Alfie's Star text and have created some amazing stories that we are super proud of. In Maths, Year 2 have been focusing on sorting 2D and 3D shapes, then talking about position and direction. In English, Year 2 have been planning and writing our own version of The Last Wolf.

# **DICKENS CLASS**

This week we have been busy completing our Hot Task Play Script writing up in English and It has been great to read such amazing work. It has been a thoroughly enjoyable unit of work and every child in the class has put in an incredible amount of effort to perfect the use of all the key features a successful play script has.

In Maths we finished our conversion of measurement topic by studying Leonardo Da Vinci's Vitruvian Man and we looked at the proportion of our limbs and, spans and height to work out what relationships exist between body parts. Did you know your foot is the same size as the inside of your elbow to your wrist?

We have also been looking at the human form in Art and have closely studied perspective. We have learnt how to sketch figures of perfect proportion based on perspective. We have mastered how to use horizons and vanishing points to create depth in a composition.

# **SASSOON CLASS**

It has been a bit of a topsy-turvy week due to the year 6 SATS and therefore having to be more flexible with the structure of the day.

In Maths the year 3's have been learning about length and perimeter. They have been doing lots of practical lessons involving measuring objects. The year 4's have been learning about decimals and they have been working really hard and really persevering with it.

In English we have continued to read and discuss Charlotte's Web and the children have been writing their own playscripts inspired by a scene in the book. We will hopefully be finishing off the week by watching the film as a treat. In Science we had a very practical lesson with a quiz and making a whizzer wheel which is made up of 6 colours and when spun they appear white. In PE the children played non competitive rallies, trying to get the highest score. In PSHE the children discussed loss, which was taken slowly and with consideration, there were some interesting discussions. This was followed by a more uplifting French lesson, in which they collated a graph of each other's choice of breakfast foods and drinks. There were some very long sentences they had to say but they impressed Mrs Wilson and Mrs Leeks with their enthusiasm.

The year 3's had an art lesson with me whilst the year 4's had violin. We were opening our portraiture unit and looked at examples and discussed them. The children then had to complete warm up activities to loosen their drawings, such as drawing with their left hand and drawing without looking at the page. This resulted in some hilarious drawings!

There has been lots of times table practice for the year 4's as the MTC check fast approaches.
