


### CLASS ATTENDANCE 13th June—17th June 2022

We have had so much fun in the Caterpillars class this week! We began the week by looking at Dinosaurs and identifying the different types. We thought about why some might have plates, fins and flippers. I was really impressed with the children's thinking! We also made some fossils out of salt dough. We welcomed back Sophie on Monday and she turned our outdoor area into a Dinosaur Park with the children being tour guides, dinosaur experts and customers. It's lovely to have her with us for the final term. She can't believe how much the children have grown! We have been looking at the sounds 'c' and 'k' in Phonics this week and in our Maths we have been learning about Heavy and Light. The children were lucky enough to go to the woods twice this week. Once on Wednesday where we had a Dinosaur Hunt and again on Friday where the children did some Art with clay. Thursday and Friday were our Water Fun days which the children have absolutely loved! We had water balloons, water guns and the sprinkler and the paddling pool came out on Friday. The children in Blyton Class became poets this week! They worked incredibly hard, learning how to rhyme and they blew us away with their fantastic poems about slugs. Everyone tried their best and the children were proud of their achievement. In Maths, we have been solving problems involving height and weight including how to correctly order the height of different objects by measuring them with cubes and exploring whether or not the size of an object relates to its weight. We have also had a brilliant time in the sunshine in our outside environment. The children thoroughly enjoyed

creating and playing in the role play ice cream shop, ordering their favourite ice creams and counting out the correct money to pay for it. It was wonderful to see how cooperatively the children played with each other and the firm

friendships that they have made this year and will continue to form in Year One.

### AUSTEN CLASS

This week has been a busy one learning about what keep us healthy in science, making religious symbols in RE and how the human body changes as we get older in Jigsaw.

In Year 1 we have been focusing on number bonds when adding 2-digit numbers and applying our knowledge when creating our own equations. In English we have been creating some amazing work based on the book 'Where the wild things are'.

Year 2 have explored measures this week. We read thermometers and talked about what makes the temperature warmer and cooler. We experimented with different temperatures of water to see how much the temperature changed. We have also explored capacity and used a litre of water to test the capacity of a variety of containers. In English we have started a new book, Where the Wild Things Are which we have so far enjoyed. We're looking forward to creating some exciting alternatives to the story.

This week in Dickens we have been very busy both completing and starting new topics and units in various subjects.

In Maths we have finished learning about decimals multiplication and now started a new unit on 2D and 3D shape which will see us get creative with our learning over the coming week.

In English we have finished writing amazing character descriptions and moved on to starting a unit of work on settings. Eventually we will be putting all this together to produce some wonderful pieces of creative writing with our finely tuned skills.

In Geography this week we have summited Mt Everest and learnt all about the Death Zone, the altitude above which human life can not survive. We used this as a springboard for looking at the differences between living in low land areas and living in mountainous regions.

In French we have continued to study fashion and clothing and in computing we have dug a little deeper into flat file databases and the importance of data storage.
