

## DICKENS CLASS

This week in Dickens we have mainly been completing CATS and English assessments, however we have still managed to complete a lot of other things.

In English we have been exploring fact files and in groups we have been challenged with gathering, sorting and reporting information on certain topics. The children have needed to work together to assign duties to each other in their groups, and then pull together information from a range of sources on their specialist subjects. They then had to sort and categorise the information and start putting together a fact file/ about it. It has been great to see effective teamwork happening as they complete their tasks. I'm sure the final results will be superb.

In Maths we have focused on recapping on our knowledge of decimals and so far we have looked at place value and decimal addition using a range of strategies.

In art we have been studying colour in composition and have looked at tone, shade, tint, hue and mood, and explored how we can alter each of these to change how a painting makes us feel. We were also all able to put our mixing skills to the text when trying to accurately recreate colour spectrum wheels with paint.

#### **ROWLING CLASS**

This week we've thrown ourselves into our writing. We've read some more of our book, 'The Viewer,' and created the next part of the story ourselves. We've had some very mysterious happenings in our stories and created some excellent writing. Elsewhere we've looked more at rhythm, tone and tempo in music and started to read musical notes, in computing we've looked more at coding on scratch - this week learning more about sensing and creating random operators. In science we've done some research into the value of drinking water and in Jigsaw we've continued to look at relationships.

#### SASSOON CLASS

In Maths, the years 3's have continued to learn about area and perimeter and looking at cm and mm units.

The year 4's have been working really hard at their decimals work and we have progressed onto hundredths.

In English we have moved onto our new class text which is 'Window' by Jeannie Baker. This book has no words, only pictures, however there are so many messages and stories with the windows. The children began with their cold task and then made their own windows for what they can see from their own window at home, using collage.

In Science we looked at reflections with a few activities. They used mirrors to write secret messages and discovered how difficult it is to follow a maze using a mirror and we discussed why this is.

We are nearing the end of our French topic and the children have been working so hard and showing huge enthusiasm, impressing Mrs Wilson.

In PSHE there were important discussions about friendship. In computing we have been looking at image editing. To finish off a great week, we will be creating images of the queen for display at the Zion chapel.
