Dear Parents,

I had a useful meeting with the parent class reps on Wednesday of this week. We are aware that we need to do more to improve communication with parents. CHICKENS

We are developing our garden area and as part of this we have looked in to plants that are beneficial to the health of chickens. We intend to have some hanging in their coop but also as a walk for the chickens to meander through when they're walking around the garden. Useful plants for chickens are:

Lavender- calming properties

Nasturtium- antiseptic properties

Rosemary- perfect for near chickens dust bath

Sage- great for general chicken health

Oregano- a chicken superfood

Fennel- attracts insects for chickens to eat

Sunflowers- the dried seed heads are great for chickens

Thyme- good for chickens respiratory health
