Many people call the music that rappers use hip-hop music.</p> <p>One way to think of the staff is like a graph for music. Composers write rests, musical symbols (such as accidentals) and notes on the staff to indicate the pitch of musical notes.</p>	<p>Structure - Most music is underpinned by a structure which may be as simple as beginning, middle and end.</p> <p>Verse -The section of a song which generally ‘tells the story’.</p> <p>Chorus- The part of a song which repeats between the verses.</p> <p>Bridge - a passage of music that links two sections of music together.</p> <p>Timbre - all instruments, including voices, have a particular sound quality which is referred to as timbre, eg squeaky</p> <p>Diminuendo- getting quieter</p> <p>Crescendo - getting louder.</p> <p>Texture - Layers of sound, such as those created by a melody accompanied by a drum beat.</p> <p>Tempo (plural tempi) The speed at which music is performed, usually described in terms of fast/slow.</p>
