Music can be composed in a major key, or a minor key. In between the notes on a stave are accidentals - sharps (♯) and flats (♭). The '♭' symbol means that a note is played a semitone lower, and a '♯' means that a note is played a semitone higher.	 Music in major keys generally tends to sound bright, happy, or uplifting. This is because the way notes in major keys sound together is very pleasing to our ears. Music in a minor key is constructed differently, since it sounds less pleasing and/or at least uneasy. Several of the notes in minor are lowered by a semitone. This makes the music sound slightly more dissonant, or a little less pleasing. Because of this, music in minor keys often tends to sound more sombre, sad, or anguished. How to remember the different music notes: Mnemonics can be used to help remember all the different notes and musical notation symbols. These all read from the bottom of the stave to the top. Treble clef lines: Every Green Bus Drives Fast — the notes are E, G, B, D and F. Treble clef spaces: The notes in the treble clef spaces spell FACE - FACE in the space. Bass clef lines: Good Burritos Don't Fall Apart. The notes are G, B, D, F and A. Bass clef spaces: All Cows Eat Grass. The notes are A, C, E and G. 	 Song Cycle - A structure of music in which a group of songs is performed in a defined sequence Phrasing - A small unit of a melody, often corresponding to a line of a song Key-The 'key' of a piece of music refers to the scale on which the music is based and around which related harmonies are built. For instance a piece may be in the key of C major, meaning that its tonic, or home note, is the note C and the notes of its scale are C D E F G A B C. Middle eight - A type of musical bridge – it is a short eight-bar passage in the middle of a song that links two sections. Minor Key -One of the most common types of eight-note musical scale. Often described as having a sad sound. Major key -One of the most common types of eight-note musical scale. Often described as having a happy sound. flat p In written music, a flat lowers the pitch of a note by half a step.
