## **English**

Texts: Stone Age Boy / How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth

Fiction: We will use varied word classes and paragraphs to structure an interesting and creative narrative in similar style to our explored texts.

Non-fiction: We will create instructions for washing a mammoth and an explanation of how life in Britain changed across the Stone Age.

# Science

Topic: Animals including Humans
We will explore a variety of animals
including humans to learn about and

compare their diets, skeletons, muscles and survival needs. We will engage in practical investigations and experiments to develop our scientific skills including setting up comparative tests, collecting results and forming conclusions.

## **History**

Enquiry Question: How did life in Britain change between the old Stone Age and the Iron Age?

We will explore major changes and developments across the time period from the Paleolithic Age to the Iron Age. As historians, we will look carefully at our evidence of the era including cave paintings, artefacts such as flint tools and secondary sources to make observations about the past. We will be able to describe the changes within this period of prehistory and justify our points of view using the evidence that we collect.
