Grmalem reported "I am proud of who I am, who I have become.I had to argue with the government for five years before they let my family in the UK. I am hoping to get married soon".

Obaida (the other youth ambassador) also told us about his story. Obaida came from Homs in Syria. Obaida told the class that he was forced to flee

Obaida reported "I had no future in Homs, the war forced me to leave Homs". Obaida also loves nature; he loves to see rabbits wandering past the university campus in Canterbury.

Maybe you are wondering why the work of KRAN is so important. Well KRAN supports young refugees to to build their future in the UK, as Fawzia (the youth officer) explained to us.



Both these refugees have astounding stories to tell and have learnt from their past.
